Thank you for your follow up email of 21 February 2024 about signage.

All tourist sign applications must be first submitted to our tourist sign inbox at: touristinformationsigns@nationalhighways.co.uk.

Section A of the application form must be filled out by the applicant, Section B needs to be filled out by the home highway authority (HHA). The HHA is the highway authority for the road which provides the main direct access to a tourist destination or leisure facility. For information, we've attached a blank application form.

The application would be assessed against CG152 of the Design Manual for Roads and Bridges. Could you please ensure all supporting documents are submitted with the form.

We're aware that a tourist sign application was submitted around August 2023, however Section B of the form was not filled out, subsequently the form was returned back to the applicant.

If the application is deemed successful, we'd invite the them to enter into a S278 agreement with ourselves, this will be further explained later subject to the review outcome.

Please note, meeting the eligibility criteria does not mean that a tourist destination or leisure facility is automatically entitled to tourist or leisure signs. Other factors such as the safe accommodation of signs within the highway are also assessed.

Thank you for your email of 13 November 2023 about additional signage on the A30 for Treguddick.

Having looked at the junction itself it's minor in nature with the A30. On the westbound approach, there is a junction warning sign in place prior to the actual turn off – see Google link [here](#) - which appears to be in accordance with Traffic Signs Chapter 4 requirements.

In general, the more important junctions normally have either a stack or a map sign in place prior to the turn off, others only have a Diagram no 506.1 (junction warning) in place. The type of sign used depends on the importance of destination, road classification, volume of traffic and junction type. The flag sign by the junction for Treguddick is in the driver's view from approximately 140m prior to the turn off.

Our initial assessment is that the current westbound signing is in order and conforms to Traffic Signs Manual Chapter 4 requirements, therefore we do not have any plans to improve it. To avoid sign clutter, it is our policy to not use advance directional signing at minor junctions. We hope this helps with your enquiry.
